Aim: opening up **digital opportunities** for people and business; making the **EU's single market fit for the digital age**

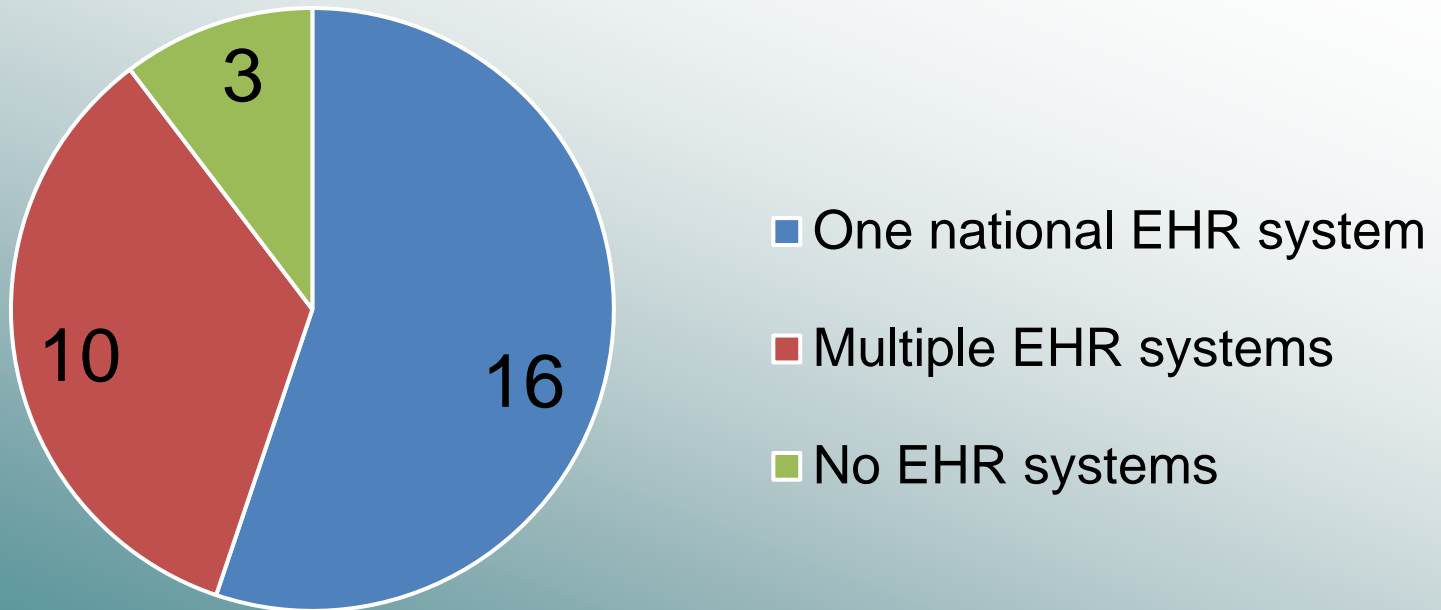
Mid-term review: 35 legislative proposals and policy initiatives. **3 key areas for further action: Data economy, cybersecurity, online platforms**

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EHR systems in place single national vs. multiple

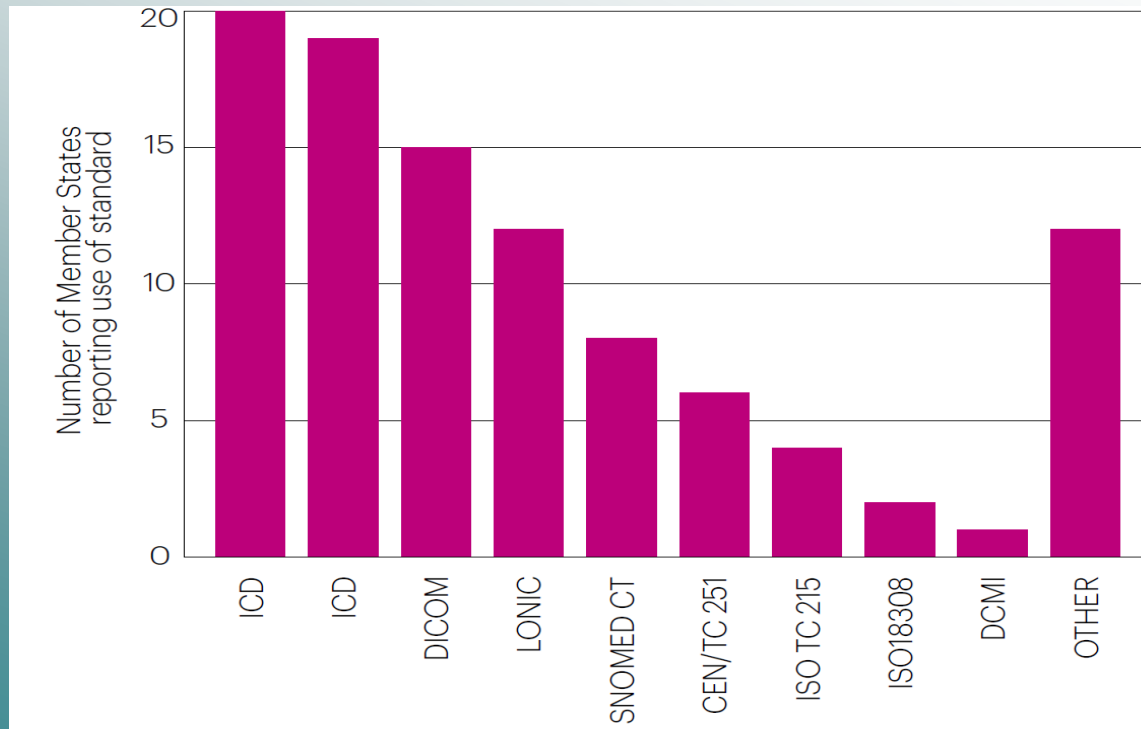


Single national v. multiple EHR systems currently in place (N=29) (*JAsEHN Final Report on EU state of play on patient access on eHealth data 2017*)



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Standards in national EHR systems (WHO European region)

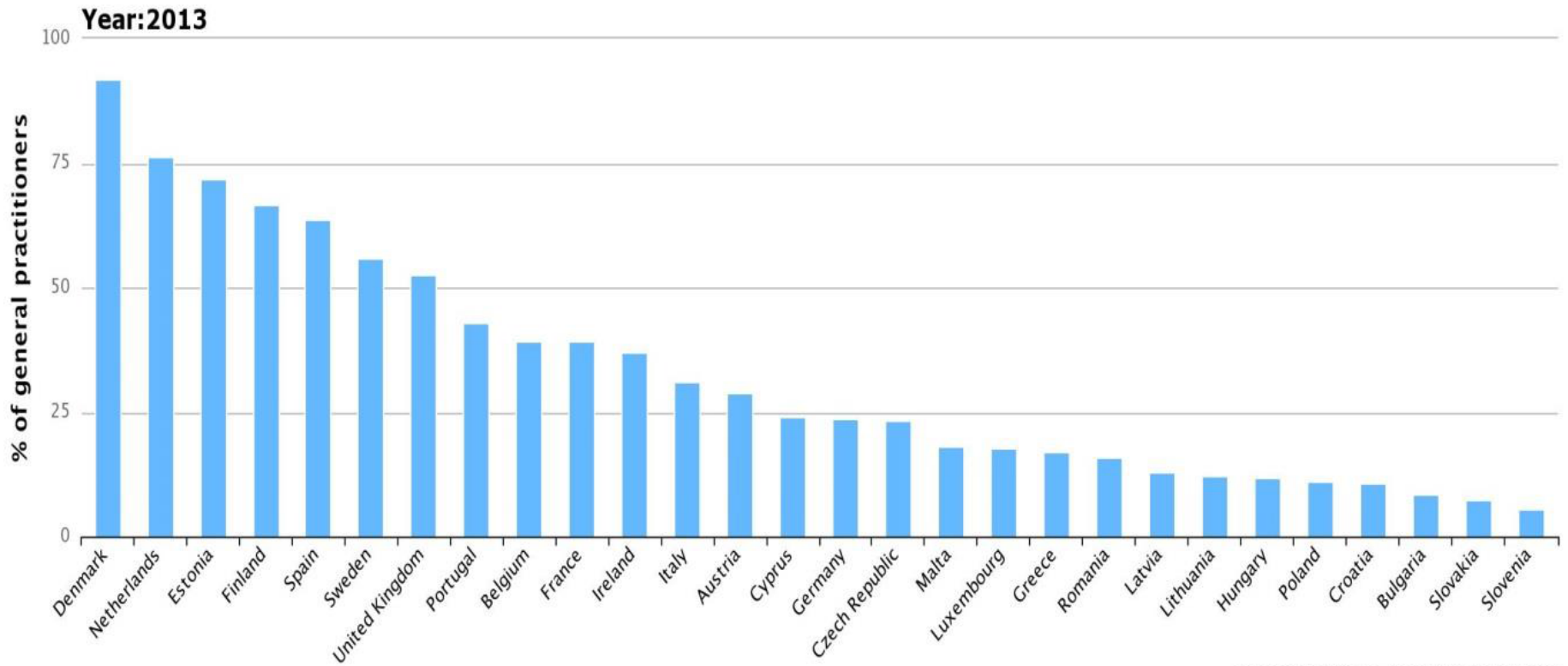

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GPs exchanging patient data with other professionals / healthcare providers

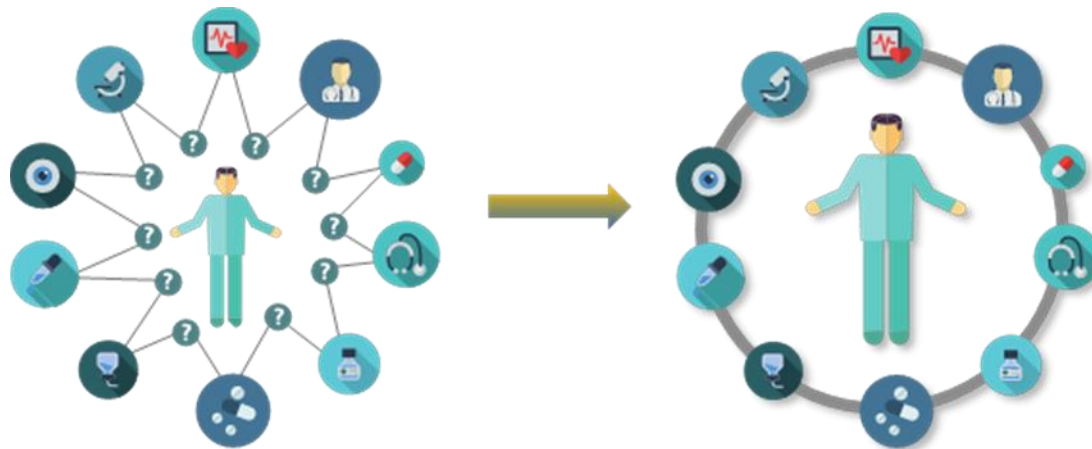

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Public consultation on Health and Care in the Digital Single Market

Open between: 20 July – 12 October 2017

1464 respondents – 30% organisations + 70% individuals

Replies from 35 countries – also from beyond Europe

Health and care organisations are the largest group of respondent organisations

Structured around the 3 pillars



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Public consultation – Summary of results



Citizens should be able to manage their own data:

>90% strongly agree or agree



Sharing health data can be beneficial:

>80% strongly agree or agree



**Not having access to digital health services:
Nearly 60%**



Citizen feedback to healthcare providers is essential to improve services:

>80% agree
